Dear Families.

Here we are at the tail end of Week 3, slowly approaching the half-way mark of Term 2. So many **important conversations** have been had, many **stories and experiences have been shared** and importantly, I feel we as a school community are making slow, steady, **positive progress**.

I wish to firstly acknowledge the strong and hardworking Mothers of our community, who celebrated 'Mother's Day' over the weekend. A huge thanks to Carly for sourcing the student gifts for this special occasion. I also appreciate the positive efforts of our teaching staff in helping the students make these gifts extra special.

As you're aware, last week was a **Pupil Free Day**. This presented an opportunity for staff to come together and **continue the improvement process, outlined within our school 'Numeracy Goal'** (recorded in our Site Improvement Plan). The morning consisted of quality discussion, facilitated by the Portfolio's Maths Lead, *Sarah Centofanti*. In the afternoon, myself and the teachers 'put all the learning together', **identifying the core elements that occur in EVERY Maths lesson**. We were able to collaboratively decide on an updated **lesson structure to trial**, that will be reflective of **quality curriculum planning**, **effective pedagogy**, **assessment and feedback**. I will meet with staff every fortnight, to reflect on our progress and importantly, analyse the successes and failures.



Classroom News: Kangaroos (R-3)



This term in the Kangaroos classroom, we have been **focusing on people and places.** Over the past three weeks, we have created a strong focus on Japanese culture within our classroom with the children. All four of our University Pre-service teachers have helped us create a **'sushi shop' dramatic play area**, for the children to explore and enjoy. The children were very excited with the new space, especially with the wooden sushi that they discovered in the new learning area. They interacted wonderfully with one another and showed respect to their environment and resources.

Continuing the sushi theme, Pre-service teacher Heidi, **made delicious sushi** with the children in a **cooking lesson.** The children were required to choose and measure out each of the ingredients they wanted to use in their sushi before rolling it up, and of course tasting the delicious creations! The students then continued their sushi making through their writing lesson, recording the ingredients they used and the sushi making process.









In our **Music lessons**, we are learning **'Drumming'**. During these lessons. the children are focusing on percussion and rhythm and how these are used together to create and play a song. The children's music is coming along very nicely!


