My areas of interest/specialty are collaborative composition, building ensemble programs and string programs.

## Music Information (from Thea)



**Program Goal:** For students to access their creative agency and to see themselves as creative individuals with the ability to confidently articulate, share and explore their ideas/experiences through music.

We will explore the following musical tools to support students in achieving this goal:

- Developing a sense of meter/pulse
- Creating and aurally copying rhythms including syncopated rhythms
- Using scales/concept of tonal centre and patterns to create melodies
- Aurally copy 2 note motifs (high and low)
- Whole body, active listening (drawing on deep listening principles) to encounter new sonic experiences

The ways of creating we will explore include:

- Playing instruments (pitched and unpitched percussion + other instruments of interest)
- Body percussion
- Scoring (writing music, graphic notation, lyrics, text etc.)
- Collaborative composition (whole class and small group)
- Collective singing
- Engaging with/listening to music from a diverse array of voices/genres, with a focus on living composers and canonically underrepresented voices

**For the R-2 class,** I would like to focus on developing a sense of meter/pulse and introducing elements such as rhythm and pitch, through a play-based, movement and singing-centred approach. This would look like a series of short activities/games in each lesson, with time for individual and group creative exploration.

**For both the Year 3-4 and 5-6 classes,** I'd like to work with a more project-based approach as this has worked well for me at Morphett Vale East School where I was employed in a similar position. This would look like 4-5 week projects where students create original music, each project with a different focus and method of creating. There would be an opportunity to perform/record/video these projects at the end of each one to share with the wider school community.

**For all classes,** I'd love to utilise the beautiful setting of Scott Creek Primary School. I love to use soundwalks and soundscapes to encourage deep listening. I aim to work with the students outside - walking, listening and creating, I feel that would be a really great opportunity to take advantage of.

## Additional News



### School Crossing – Signage Upgrade SUCCESSFUL

We've fought long and hard to have our school crossing re-assessed. Thankfully, the Adelaide Council has responded to my requests and conducted a thorough assessment. **The following recommendations have been made, with works to commence in January (2024):**

- Enhancements to the safety of the existing Emu Crossing, particularly concerning the safety of children and motorists, are both feasible and advisable. Currently, the signage at the crossing is inadequately sized, a significant concern given the road's horizontal and vertical alignment, which could compromise motorist's visibility and reaction times.
- This situation poses a direct risk to the safety of children using the crossing. **Therefore, it is proposed that the current signage, designated as size 'A', be upscaled to size 'B'.** This increase in sign dimensions is anticipated to significantly improve motorist's awareness and safety, thereby offering improved safety and protection for pedestrians, as well as all road users.
- Furthermore, **it is strongly recommended that signs be installed on both sides of the approaching side of the road.** This strategic placement will not only aid in alerting motorists but also reinforce safe crossing habits among children, enhancing their ability to see and navigate the crossing safely.
- Additionally, the existing location of the eastbound Children's Crossing (W6-3) and Crossing Ahead (W8-22) signs is substandard due to being positioned on a bend, thereby reducing its visibility and effectiveness AHC – Emu Crossing Assessment - 3 - (reduced sight distance) for motorists as they approach the crossing. **To rectify this issue, it is recommended that the sign be relocated approximately 25m west,** aimed at ensuring greater visibility and safety for both pedestrians and motorists, with a particular focus on enhancing the sanctuary of children using the crossing.

### School Upgrade - \$25,000 grant



- **THREE x new exhaust systems** are soon to be installed throughout our school (later than expected due to manufacturing delay), to extract air from inside the classroom to remove pathogens and lower cO2 levels (courtesy of a \$25,000 school upgrade grant – a huge thank you to **Julie Marron** for her support).
- This means that in a few weeks' time, there will be guaranteed 'quality air' in all three of our classrooms, plus the library space in the main building. Hopefully, this will allow us to see a reduced rate of sicknesses and absences. Healthy air INSIDE and OUTSIDE at Scott Creek – sounds great to me! ☺
