Public transport access

There is no public transport access to Scott Creek Primary School. Students are able to access the Heathfield High School bus from Ironbank which stops at Scott Creek before and after school.

2. Students (and their welfare)

General characteristics

Students travel to Scott Creek Primary School from various Hills locations. Our students come from a range of socio economic backgrounds. Currently, about 30% of our students benefit from school card. Parents have a high level of involvement with the school and, along with the students, have established a strong sense of community.

Pastoral care programs

The school community and our small classes, by their nature, encourage close cooperative, supportive relationships between staff and students.

An understanding of Growth/Fixed Mindsets and the 'Habits of Mind', have been implemented to provide students with the foundations for achievement and social / emotional wellbeing. Our school values are unpacked regularly and form the basis for our expectation for ourselves and the way we treat others. Students have been explicitly taught the 'Zones of Regulation' and refer to these zones when 'checking-in' throughout the day.

School values are Positive, Caring and Inspired.

Support offered

Early Intervention programs (Minilit + Bond Blocks) for students with learning difficulties, 1:1 support for students with special needs, as well as general classroom support.

Cyber safety sessions are compulsory - occur annually for Year 3-6 students.

Student management

Scott Creek Primary has a well-developed student behaviour support policy which is based on Restorative Practices, and aims to ensure that all students are successful and have the right to enjoy being safe and feeling safe at our school. The maintenance of positive adult / student and student / student relationships create the foundations for effective student behaviour support.

Student Government

Student Voice is an integral part of our school. Classrooms are democratic and hold regular class meetings. Each class has Kid's Council Representatives who meet once a fortnight to discuss issues affecting student welfare, fundraising and whole school initiatives. Student initiated activities occur each term. Students work on environment and sustainability projects around the school and in the local community.

AUSLAN, Science, Gardening, Outdoor learning, Music/Drama, Instrumental music (private lessons offered), SAPSASA sport, Swimming & Aquatics, Readers Cup, Premiers Reading Challenge, CreARTive, Environmental Walk, Bandicoot / Stringy bark Habitat Projects, Oliphant Science, First Lego League, bi-annual school camp, Combined Small School Sports Day, Fabulous Friday transition program, cooking and kitchen/garden program.

3. Key School Policies

Special needs

Scott Creek Primary School focuses on early intervention and all students with a disability have a One Plan. Literacy and Numeracy interventions are provided either individually or in small groups. Extension activities are offered through Lego League and Readers Cup.

Special curriculum features

- AUSLAN was introduced in 2023 and in 2024 has evolved into Cultural Studies.
- Science and Outdoor Learning was introduced in 2023 and continues.
- Music continues in 2024.
- Walker Learning
- Performing Arts

Teaching Pedagogy

Student centred learning is a priority at Scott Creek Primary School.

We critically reflect on our practices with a view of continuous improvement, providing our students with strategies to examine their own learning strengths and areas for further development.

Our school utilises the Walker Learning Approach which supports student-led learning. Along with a strong focus on STEAM and Literacy, all students learn to play at least one musical instrument.

Parents are encouraged to inquire any time about student achievement.

Joint Programs

- We are part of the Mt Lofty Partnership. We have strong ties with Mylor, Heathfield and Basket Range Primary Schools, through our 'Small Schools Sports Day'.
- Scott Creek and Macclesfield staff also combine for professional learning and joint staff meetings to analyse student data.

5. Sporting Activities

- We encourage all students to actively be involved in the many physical activity options provided by the local sporting groups in our district.
- We promote student participation in SAPSASA activities during school time.
- All children attend swimming lessons and the Year 6 students take part in Aquatics.
- Outdoor play in our natural environment is a focus.

6. Other Co-Curricular Activities

General

- Our students are involved in many environmentally focused programs.

7. Staff (and their welfare)

Staff profile

- We have 8 part time staff and 3 full time staff.
- We have a high staff attendance rate.

Leadership structure

Scott Creek Primary School has one Principal. All staff take on leadership responsibilities.

Staff support systems

Staff work collaboratively and as a whole school learning team (R-6).

Performance Management

All staff recognise that they have a responsibility to be involved in an ongoing program of Performance Development and be committed to continuous improvement in relation to school planning and individual direction. Regular discussions are held with the Principal.

Access to special staff

Support staff is accessed via the District office in Mt Barker.

Instrumental music lessons are offered for a variety of instruments.

Other

Because of our school size we use a whole school approach to most planning. We value working collaboratively as a team.

8. Incentives, support and award conditions for Staff

There are no special incentives or awards applying to this school apart from working with a great school community.

9. School Facilities

Buildings and grounds

- The original building houses the staff room, admin area, intervention room, koala room and library.
- > We have a specialist classroom for Music, Drama and private tuition.

- A double classroom was established with BER P21 funding. One classroom is used for the JP class, while the other has a kitchen area and used for Walker Learning and cooking. The building is our called our 'Junior Learning Centre'.
- > A covered playground was installed in 2006.
- Our asphalt area was upgraded in 2020.
- Our oval and stringy bark habitat, on the other side of Scott Creek Road, is spacious and engaging for students. There is a large area for cubby building and nature play.

Cooling

All rooms are air conditioned.

Specialist facilities

- We have a device to student ratio of 1:1.
- > Scott Creek Community Hall is used for special performances and showcases.
- Our Environmental Walk incorporates Kid's Creek, outdoor musical instruments, children's 'Juicy Veggie Garden', goat, quail and chook houses, pond and other areas for creative play.
- Our Stringybark Forest area surrounding the oval and has an extensive and popular 'cubby' building area.

Access for students and staff with disabilities

We have ramp access to the majority of the teaching areas and the disabled toilet. Our facilities will be upgraded on a needs basis.

Access to bus transport

We have no access to the public transport system at Scott Creek.

The local school bus brings children in from Ironbank and Bradbury.

10. School Operations

Decision making structures

Decision making is shared between Staff, Governing Council and Student Council.

Two teachers are members of our Personnel Advisory Committee (PAC).

Regular publications

We have a weekly staff bulletin (OneNote), regular school & community newsletter, School Information Booklet (updated yearly), and Learning in the Early Years/Transition booklets.

Other communication

All classes use 'SeeSaw' to communicate to families.

School financial position

The school has a sound financial base.

General characteristics

The local community has a strong commitment to the school.

The area is semi-rural and many parents commute to the city or nearby Hills towns for work.

Parent and community involvement

Our parent and community involvement is one of the things that make us special.

We have an informed and active Governing Council.

We work closely with the 'Scott Creek Progress Association' and 'The Friends of Scott Creek Conservation Park'.

Feeder schools

Our students come to us from nearby kindergartens in Aldgate, Stirling, Coromandel Valley. We are a feeder school for Heathfield High, but many of our Year 6s also go on to Urrbrae Agricultural High School, Mitcham Girls and win places in the Glenunga International High School Ignite program.

Stirling is 10km away. There are no shops at Scott Creek.
